

## 2008 Population Estimates

Office of National Statistics Mid-Year Estimates 2008

**Yorkshire's population** exceeds 5 million people, roughly twice the size of Wales and equivalent to the population of New Zealand. Nearly 50% of Yorkshire's population is concentrated in West Yorkshire. Meanwhile, the county of North Yorkshire has the second lowest population density in England.
